Because in our work, people are the most important! We treat each of them individually and try to make sure they get the support they need most.





Help Centers for Foreigners (CPC)

HELP CENTERS FOR FOREIGNERS IN WARSAW, ŁÓDŹ AND ŁOMŻA




The Help Center for Foreigners is a key place in the Ocalenie Foundation. People who need the support of mentors, career counselors, psychological or legal support can seek assistance here.

The Help Centers for Foreigners currently operate in three cities in Poland: **Warsaw, Łomża and Łódź.**

People from 95 countries received support at the CPC in Warsaw.

Most people came from Ukraine (55.8%), Belarus (14.4%), Russia (5.2%), Afghanistan (3.2%).





Additional activities of the Help Center for Foreigners in Warsaw

PSYCHOLOGICAL TEAM

In addition to individual psychological consultations, the following consultations were conducted:

• an integrative Russian-language group in the form of a song and dance circle, which met 11 times and was attended by women from Belarus, Ukraine, Poland, Uzbekistan, Kazakhstan (a total of 50 people),

• Tajik-Persian support group, which met 20 times with 14 women from Afghanistan and Tajikistan participating regularly,

• a support-therapeutic group for women from Ukraine, which met 18 times.

The groups were organised by the **CPC in Warsaw.**

PSYCHOLOGICAL TEAM

HELP CENTER FOR VICTIMS OF TORTURES (CPOT)



The psychological team conducted 1,368 hours of psychological and psychotherapeutic consultations within the framework of the Help Center for Victims of Tortures.

People with experience of torture received:

- psychological,
- psychiatric,
- social,
- legal support.

In 2023, 149 people - 122 adults and 27 children - benefited from the Help **Center for Victims of Tortures**. Those supported were primarily from Belarus, Russia, Ukraine, Tajikistan, Afghanistan and 17 other countries.

CPOT is a project which has been implemented by the Ocalenie Foundation since 2020, funded by the UN Voluntary Fund for Victims of Torture.

LEGAL SUPPORT TEAM



The legal support team actively supported the activities of the Ocalenie Foundation:

- won redress for those wrongfully detained while providing humanitarian aid on the Polish-Belarusian border,
- published the Ocalenie
 Foundation's position on amendments to the Law on
 Foreigners,
- published the Ocalenie
 Foundation's position on amendments to the speculative
 law on assistance to citizens of
 Ukraine.

POLISH LANGUAGE COURSES

POLISH LANGUAGE COURSES IN WARSAW

In 2023, we announced four open calls for language courses in Warsaw.

During four trimesters, people from **71 countries** took part in the classes. Most participants were from **Ukraine**, **Belarus**, **Russia**, **Afghanistan and Turkey**.

POLISH LANGUAGE COURSES IN ŁÓDŹ AND ŁOMŻA

We announced two enrollments for **Polish language courses in Łódź.**

The classes were held in two trimesters and **55 people** from 14 countries took part, most of them from Ukraine and Belarus. Among others were also people from Jordan, Guinea, Brazil and Armenia. The classes were conducted by a team of **5 lecturers**.

Polish language lessons **were also conducted in Łomża.** They were attended by **67 people.**



CAREER COUNSELING



In 2023, 24 people raised their professional competencies by participating in courses in IT, cosmetology, floristry, tailoring, computer graphics, accounting, and specialised authorizations (e.g. forklifts, welding).






IN-KIND SUPPORT: PARCELS TO GUARDED CENTRES FOR FOREIGNERS (SOC)



The Foundation sends parcels with **cosmetics**, **underwear**, **socks**, rucksacks and warm clothes to people in Guarded Centres for Foreigners (SOC). At the request of inmates, notebooks, crayons, pens, books, puzzles and toys for children were also provided.

- In 2023, we sent 901 such parcels to **934 people**, including 30 women and 15 children.
- Statistically, every inmate received help from us, some of them even several times.
- We exchanged more than **5,000 email** messages with inmates.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT



Foundation's clients were able to receive support in the form of prepaid cards to shops, as well as gift cards for the purchase of **school kits and necessities.**

At the CPC in Warsaw:

 571 families received cards for the purchase of school kits for 887 children.

At the CPC in Łódź:

- **55 families** received prepaid cards,
- **635 families** received cards for the purchase of school kits,
- **300 women** received Dignity Kits.

At the CPC in Łomża:
228 families received cards for the purchase of school kits,
280 individuals received support in the form of care packages,
228 women received Dignity Kits.

HELP AT THE POLISH-BELARUSIAN BORDER

Since August 2021, we have continuously brought humanitarian aid at the Polish-Belarusian border:

at least **401 people** in need contacted the Foundation in 2023,

Foundation volunteers intervened **100 times** and provided direct assistance to **368 people** (including at least 34 women and 15 children and minors),

58 people were on duty at the border, in shifts.

They were from: Afghanistan, Chechnya, Dagestan, Tajikistan, Russia. **One family** was granted humanitarian residence (3 persons).

- One child was born.
- 3 families became independent and got a communal flat.

The Welcome Home program supports refugee families to move towards self-reliance, so that once they will have participated in the program, further ongoing assistance is no longer needed.

12 families (i.e. 66 individuals, including 42 children) were included in the

REFUGEES WELCOME POLAND



Refugees Welcome Polska

We connect people living in Warsaw, who have a spare room in their home, with refugees who need it.

In 2023, 18 people who have been in Poland for no more than two years participated in the program. The program participants came from Afghanistan, the Democratic Republic of Congo, Cameroon, Uganda, Yemen and Russia.

• **10 people** benefited from housing support - they rented rooms from Polish families at a symbolic price (rent lasts 3 months, extendable to 12 months).

All persons benefited from the various forms of support offered by the Foundation and the RWP team and participated in meetings and integration events.

• Volunteers supported the program participants in learning the Polish language. Nine pairs were formed. We plan to pair more people in 2024.



DAY CARE CENTERS IN WARSAW



"The chess classes have surprised us with their enormous popularity. It is also a way to include people with different needs.

Nobody looks at who among the players is deaf, or with concentration and attention deficits. Everyone has the same opportunities. 10 children from our four day care centers took part in a chess tournament. According to the tournament results, one person is with category IV and four children with category V."

DAY CARE CENTERS IN WARSAW

In 2023, there were **four day care centers** in Warsaw. Three are located in the collective accommodation centers for refugees from Ukraine. One of the day care centers was run in a Local Community Centers (MAL).

A total of **200 children** were enrolled in the day care centers. They were supported by 10 care workers.

Children in all day care centers received **support in their studies**, worked with their emotions, participated in numerous excursions and sports, dance, chess activities.

DAY CARE CENTER IN ŁOMŻA

The day care center in Łomża is the **first and longest-running** day care center run by the Foundation.

It is attended by around **30 children** each quarter, and there were **162 children** in the whole year. In 2023, children took part in various activities:

- During the holidays, **20 children** took part in a trip to the nearby Narwianski National Park. They also went on an excursion in the Narew River Valley in Tykocin and took a water tram ride on the river.
- During the **winter holidays**, the children took part in **two one-day trips**: to Białystok - to the ice rink and to the Pharmacy Museum, and to Warsaw - to the Art Box Experience and the Copernicus Science Center.

KNOWLEDGE TO THE MAX TUTORING PROGRAM



Knowledge to the Max - a tutoring and scholarship program of the Ocalenie Foundation and the BNP Paribas Foundation.

The program supports refugee children, particularly those with learning difficulties and at risk of dropping out. Young people receive **learning support** and also participate in **workshops**, joint educational and cultural outings and camps.

In 2023, **117 children** participated in the program. **54 of them** were primary school pupils. Each child participating in the program can apply for a scholarship for the duration of the school year. It covers the student's educational needs and school fees (parents' council fees, insurance, lunches, trips and textbooks). In 2023, **36 students received such scholarships.**

Among others, young people from Afghanistan, Chechnya, Georgia, Iraq, Iran, Tajikistan, Kazakhstan, Turkey, Syria, Ukraine, Venezuela, Kyrgyzstan, took part in the program.

KNOWLEDGE TO THE MAX TUTORING PROGRAM





In October, we launched classes in Polish, mathematics and English, preparing for the **eighth-grade exam and for the matriculation exam.**

Additionally, in autumn 2023, we launched classes in computer science, visual arts and careers advice workshops for students aged 14 and above. In 2023, we awarded **21** academic and **15** support scholarships.

Children were supported by **80 tutors.**

In June, we held an exhibition entitled 'Growing up in Many Cultures', for which the young participants prepared more than 50 works.

SUMMER CAMPS

In 2023, we organised a summer camp trip for children and youth from Łomża and Warsaw.

The summer camps were attended by children participating in the tutoring program, day care centers and support from the Help Centers for Foreigners in Warsaw and Łomża. **There were 82 participants.**

During the trip they got to know Dolny Śląsk and Mazury.

SCHOOL SUPPORT PROGRAM





The school support program was created to **support the integration and adaptation of children and their parents** with migration and refugee experiences.

As part of the program, we also support schools in creating a welcoming multicultural environment by organizing training, workshops and webinars.

SCHOOL SUPPORT PROGRAM



Training for teaching staff

- 185 people teaching and working in 6 primary schools and 1 secondary school took part in training sessions, during which they learned the basics of setting up a support system for migrant and refugee children, and for their parents or guardians/caregivers.
- They also learned how to support the integration of a multicultural group and how to counteract discrimination in schools.

EDUCATIONAL POINTS AND CHILD-FRIENDLY SPACES

From January to August 2023, there were **19 education points** in long-term accommodation centers and 1 child-friendly space in an education point.

A total of **5,465 children** received support at the educational points and the safe spaces.

IKEA INTERNSHIPS



The second edition of the internship project was carried out in cooperation with IKEA Retail Sp. z o.o. in Warsaw, Łódź, Gdańsk and Kraków.

Ocalenie Foundation shared its knowledge and experience from the pilot with partner organizations: Immigrants Support Center in Gdańsk, Salam Lab and Laboratory for Peace and Internationaler Bund Polska in Krakow, who supported the implementation of the project in the respective cities.

During the project, people were provided with an intensive Polish language course during working hours, mentoring, legal support, psychological support and help from the career advisors.
